**Shuttle Service A** shuttle will provide transportation from parking at the Jonesborough Middle and Elementary Schools to the Historic Jonesborough Visitors Center on Boone Street (shown above). Cost is \$5 to park and \$1 per person, each way, to shuttle (age 5 and under free).

# National Storytelling Festival Parking and Special Services

## Parking

On Friday, Saturday and Sunday you may park your vehicle at Jonesborough Elementary School located at 306 Forest Drive, approximately 1 mile from Festival grounds. There will be signs on 11-E to assist you in locating the school. Enter the parking area from US Highway 11-E and ride a shuttle to the Jonesborough Visitors Center where Festival Registration is located. The shuttle runs continuously from the school to the Visitors Center beginning at 8:00 a.m. and ending soon after the last event each day. The fee to park is \$5 per car and proceeds benefit the David Crockett Band Boosters and the Jonesborough Elementary PTA. The shuttle is \$1 per person each way (5 and under free).

## Parking

In order for us to best utilize limited parking resources, we will require the presentation of a valid disabled parking placard or license plate for access to these parking areas:

**1** on map – off Fox Street next to the *Courthouse Tent*. This lot also includes a few spaces reserved for vehicles with lifts. First come, first served. Donations accepted.


**2** on map – Fox Street. First come, first served. No fee.

**3** on map – First Baptist Church located at 201 East Main Street. The fee to park in this location is \$20 per day. This parking is for those able to maneuver a short hill with a sidewalk.

## Courtesy Carts

At various times throughout the weekend there will be courtesy carts to aid individuals with limited mobility. These carts will run a continuous route from the **Visitors Center to Second Avenue** with stops in **front of the Courthouse and the Log Cabin**, but they do not go to individual tents. **Note: Courtesy Carts will not run past 8:00 p.m.**

## Drop-offs

If you are accompanying a wheelchair passenger, you may drop him or her off at the loading/unloading zone in front of the Visitors Center, located at 117 Boone Street. Once drop-offs are made, cars **MUST** then move to a parking space. If  parking is full, a driver may drop off riders at the Visitors Center and travel to the Elementary School to ride the shuttle back to the Visitors Center, where Festival Registration is located.

## Restrooms

Wheelchair accessible restrooms are located at the Historic Jonesborough Visitors Center, the International Storytelling Center, near Creekside Tent and at Mill Spring Park. Wheelchair accessible portable restrooms are also available on Festival grounds. All restrooms are designated on the map.

## Reserved Seats for Hearing Impaired

Seats for the hearing impaired are available on a first-come, first-served basis at the front of each performance tent. Available seats may be claimed until 10 minutes before the programming begins.
